**The Dresden Music Festival thanks its audience and gets in the mood for 2011
- Concert premiere at the recently opened Albertinum with Singapore Symphony Orchestra
and Jan Vogler on October 20, 2010 -**

Dresden, September 1, 2010. The Dresden Music Festival has left »Russlandia« and is looking back on a festival season full of unforgettable musical impressions and outstanding artistic performances.

In order to thank its audience for the great reception in 2010, the Dresden Music Festival offers a special concert for favorable ticket prices. On October 20, 2010, the Singapore Symphony Orchestra is going to perform under its chief conductor Lan Shui, Jan Vogler is the evening's soloist. This event marks the first time a concert is given in the bright inner courtyard (so-called "Lichthof") of the recently opened Albertinum. With the museum, the variety of the Festival's venues will be broadened by a place of spectacular architecture. Tickets for the concert are available for 20 and 10 Euro, ticket sale starts from September 6, 2010.

When the Singapore Symphony Orchestra and Jan Vogler perform together, it will be a meeting of good friends: The cellist appreciates the ensemble around the »enthusiastic conductor Lan Shui«; the maestro, in turn, enjoys »Germany's unique music scene«. Therefore, two masterpieces for cello and orchestra are scheduled, Fauré's »Elegy« and Tchaikovsky's »Variations on a Rococo Theme«. The dark tone poem »The Isle of the Dead« by Rachmaninov, »The Rhyme of Taigu« by Chinese composer Zhou Long and Debussy's symphonic sketches »La Mer« complete the program.

The special concert in October should also ease the waiting for the numerous top-class performances of the Festival 2011 which dates from May 18 to June 5. Theme and program of the upcoming season will be announced mid-October.
